Preface

Over the past year, our society has made significant progress in reaching out to marginalized communities through a wide range of impactful initiatives focusing on education, health, environment, women's empowerment, and cultural revival.



These initiatives have been guided by our core belief in inclusive development and the power of grassroots action. Our efforts have been driven by collaboration with educators, healthcare professionals, volunteers, and community leaders who share our mission of building a more equitable and informed society. I thank each of them for their dedication, and I hope this report provides a meaningful reflection on our shared achievements. Let us continue working together to illuminate more lives and create a sustainable path for future generations.

Programmes and Activities (2024-25)

Medicinal Plantation Awareness Programme

This year, our society launched a widespread Medicinal Plantation Awareness Programme to educate communities about the importance of medicinal plants in traditional health practices including Tulsi, Neem, Giloy, and Ashwagandha. Demonstrations on how to grow and care for these plants were conducted, and participants were encouraged to start home herbal gardens. The initiative also highlighted the need to preserve indigenous knowledge systems and reconnect with nature as a means of preventive healthcare and environmental protection.



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Health & Wellness Awareness Programme

Promoting health literacy and wellness has remained a cornerstone of our outreach efforts. In 2024–25, we successfully implemented several health awareness camps, and wellness workshops in underserved areas. These sessions covered key topics such as personal hygiene, nutrition, stress management, adolescent health, and lifestyle diseases. Certified doctors and wellness experts were invited to conduct sessions and



provide one-on-one consultations. Special attention was given to adolescent girls through menstrual hygiene education. The positive community feedback reinforced the importance of ongoing health interventions.

Sanskrit Campaign Programme

To revive interest in India's ancient cultural heritage, our Sanskrit Campaign Programme created an engaging platform for students and community members to explore the beauty of the Sanskrit language. Workshops, storytelling sessions, and sloka recitation competitions were organized in collaboration with language scholars and educators. Materials such as introductory Sanskrit booklets were distributed.



The programme emphasized Sanskrit's relevance in understanding classical texts, science, and philosophy, and worked toward making the language accessible and enjoyable for young learners.

Educational & Literacy Programme

Our flagship Educational & Literacy Programme continued to address the learning needs of underprivileged children and adults through innovative and inclusive educational support. The programme offered remedial classes, digital learning modules, and life skills education for children, while adult learners were provided with literacy



classes focused on functional reading, writing, and numeracy. We partnered with retired teachers and volunteers who offered mentorship and support. The initiative not only improved academic performance but also boosted confidence and school enrollment rates. Several children enrolled in our centres have now successfully transitioned into mainstream schools.

Skill Development Training Programme

The Skill Development Training Programme was designed to empower youth and women with practical skills to improve their employability and self-reliance. Over 300 participants completed certified training courses, with many successfully launching home-based businesses or securing jobs in local industries. Regular follow-up sessions were held to provide guidance on marketing, quality control, and digital payments. The programme not only provided participants with economic opportunities but also helped them develop soft skills like communication, time management, and teamwork—equipping them for sustainable success.



Stationery Distribution Camp

Access to basic educational materials continues to be a barrier for many children from economically disadvantaged backgrounds. Our Stationery Distribution Camp aimed to bridge this gap by distributing school kits that included notebooks, pens, pencils, erasers, rulers, geometry boxes, and school bags. In addition to distribution, motivational talks were held to inspire students to stay committed to their studies. Teachers and parents expressed appreciation for this initiative, which directly supported attendance and classroom participation. The smiles and gratitude of the children reaffirmed the impact of this simple yet essential support.



Women Empowerment Programme

Our Women Empowerment Programme made strong strides in building confidence, awareness, and financial independence among women. The programme engaged women through skill-building workshops, legal awareness camps, financial literacy sessions, and group discussions on health and social issues. Legal aid workshops provided crucial information on women's rights, domestic violence laws, and access to government schemes. Many participants shared stories of personal transformation and resilience, demonstrating the far-reaching impact of investing in women as change-makers within their families and communities.



Road Safety Awareness Programme

In light of increasing road accidents and safety concerns, our Road Safety Awareness Programme took a proactive approach to educating youth, drivers, and pedestrians about safe road practices. Conducted in partnership with local traffic police and transport departments, the programme involved awareness sessions in schools and public spaces. Topics included helmet and seatbelt use, pedestrian safety, the dangers of drunk driving, and understanding road signs. Road safety rallies, poster-making competitions, and interactive skits were conducted to make the sessions engaging. Special workshops were also organized for school bus drivers and auto-rickshaw operators, emphasizing their responsibility toward child safety.



The year 2024–25 has been one of significant achievement and deeper community engagement for Sunrise Children Educational Society. Each initiative undertaken has moved us a step closer to our mission of fostering education, health, sustainability, and empowerment at the grassroots level. As we reflect on the past year, we are reminded that real change is built through consistent, compassionate, and collective efforts.
